ECACE Scholarship Program

What's New for 2024-25?

- The program is now funded by the State of Illinois rather than with federal funding
- Appropriation is \$5 million for Fiscal Year 2025 (2024-25 award year)
- The maximum annual award amount a student may receive is \$7,500
- Graduate students are not eligible for the scholarship
- ECACE will not be available for the summer term



2024-25 ECACE Scholarship Program

What has stayed the same?

- The program is intended for those who are currently working or have worked in early childhood education and are seeking additional credentials and degrees
- Must be attending a public or non-profit private 2- or 4-year Gateways-entitled and Early Childhood Access Consortium for Equity member institution
- The scholarship may be used for any cost of attendance component
- Intended to be last payer, after other financial aid has been provided
- Recipients are expected to continue or return to teaching or direct services in the early childhood care and education field in Illinois after completion of their program of study
- Applicants are prioritized for awarding based on their Student Aid Index (SAI), from lowest to highest



ECACE Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the program an applicant must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible noncitizen or meet the undocumented student criteria of the RISE Act
- Be a member of the incumbent workforce, currently working or have worked in the early childhood industry (in either a licensed or licenseexempt facility), including home-based child care (e.g., family, friend, neighbor), center-/community-based care, Preschool for All programs, school-based preschool settings, and Head Start programs, that serve children from birth to age 5
 - Acceptable positions include teachers, assistant teachers, directors, family child care providers and assistants
 - Applicants be must be able to provide documentation confirming their current membership in the Gateways to Opportunity® Registry
- Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment on a full- or part-time (at least 3 credit hours) basis at the undergraduate level at an ECACE member institution



ECACE Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the program an applicant must:

- Be pursuing at least one of the following:
 - An Associate of Applied Science degree (or related certificate) in early childhood education or an associate degree with a concentration in early childhood at an approved college; or
 - A bachelor's degree in early childhood education, with or without a Professional Educator License
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress as established by the college
- Complete the application process on or before the ISAC-established date in order to receive priority access to funding
- Be certified as meeting eligibility requirements by the college at which the scholarship will be used
- Not be in default on any student loan, nor owe a refund on any State or federal grant



ECACE Application Process

- When available, the ECACE Application must be completed online through ISAC's Student Portal
- ISAC sends confirmation to the applicant's e-mail address when the application has been received
- Applicants must also complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) or, if applicable, an Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid for the same academic year as the ECACE application
 - The ECACE participating college must be listed on the FAFSA®
 - The student must have a valid Student Aid Index (SAI)
- Students must reapply each academic year
- Due to limited funding, and the volume of applicants, the 2024-25 ECACE Application is no longer available
 - $_{\circ}\,$ The 2025-26 application will be made available much earlier than it was able to be provided for this year




ECACE Application Process

Required Documentation

- An applicant must:
 - Provide a Gateways Registry member ID number and current Registry membership dates
 - Membership must be current to qualify for the scholarship
 - Submit an Eligibility Verification Form from the Gateways Registry
 - Applicants must download and/or print the form and then upload when completing the ECACE application
 - Provide information about their employment in the early childhood field, using information from the Gateways to Opportunity Registry
 - The Eligibility Verification Form contains members' employment history, with assigned position codes

- To obtain the Verification Form, Registry members enter through the Gateways Registry Dashboard Login
 - If an individual is not already a member, they can complete their registration on the site and then obtain their verification form



After Completing the Application ...

- Applicants will receive a confirmation e-mail when the ECACE application has been received by ISAC
- Different types letters are sent to indicate if the application is considered <u>timely</u> or <u>untimely</u>, depending on whether it was received at ISAC by the date for priority access to funding
- If an applicant needs to make a correction to their application, they will need to contact ISAC to provide the information
- Applicants must complete and submit both the ECACE application and the FAFSA (or, if applicable, Alternative Application) on or before the priority consideration date to be considered timely





2024-25 ECACE Student List Eligibility: View Screen

- The Student List Eligibility: View screen in the ECACE system displays the list
 of eligible applicants who listed your school on their application as the college
 they plan to attend and whose applications have been reviewed by ISAC staff
 for completeness
 - Students were able to select a different school for each term, and they were able to leave the school selection blank for one term
- In addition to applicant data, this screen includes the application received date and applicant category, and will include the annual award amount and award date once awarding has taken place




- Some changes have been made to ECACE processing for 2024-25 to better align it with our other programs
- Schools must now complete a **Certification** process in the ECACE system in GAP Access (similar to what is done for the Minority Teachers of Illinois Scholarship program) before awarding can be done
 - Due to limited funding, we can no longer follow the "prequalification process" that has been used the last three years to continuously award to students throughout the year
- Colleges must complete Certification for each student on their Certification List in order for the student to be considered for an award.
- Only records that need to be certified display on the Certification List
- All Certifications in the ECACE system must be completed regardless of whether the school certifies a student as eligible or ineligible




ECACE Certification List: View Screen

- To complete certification records for applicants on your school list, navigate to the Certification List: View screen by clicking on Certification tab
- Click on an individual student's name from the list the Certification Data window will open with the data fields
 - You may also use the Filter function to search for certain records




 On the Certification Data Screen, the college must indicate if the student is eligible by selecting Yes or No in the first field




 Once the data has been entered for an individual student, clicking on the Save and Submit button completes the process for that student and the applicant status information will update on the Student List: Eligibility View screen



- If the student is eligible, select "Yes"
 - When the certification process first opened, the Grade Level and Anticipated Graduation Date were required fields if "Yes" was selected
 - However, ISAC is making an adjustment to make those optional fields for the remainder of this process
 - This is intended to help make the certification process easier to complete so that we can move to awarding more quickly



 If the student is not eligible and "No" is selected, the school must provide an Ineligible Reason from the drop-down list that best fits the situation


- All Certifications available in the ECACE system must be completed regardless of whether the school certifies a student as eligible or ineligible
- The only way an applicant will receive notification of their eligibility status from ISAC is if the certification record is submitted.
- Currently, all timely renewal applicants with the lowest SAIs are appearing on schools' certification lists
 - Application review efforts have been focused on this pool of applicants for the first round of awarding that will be done once these have been certified by schools
 - As remaining applications are reviewed, they will be added to Certification lists and students will be notified, however, due to limited funding, many will not be eligible for an award
 - Additional records will appear on the Certification Lists as remaining applications are reviewed and considered complete and students will be notified



- In some cases, a student will appear on the Certification List for two schools
 - This happens when a student selected a different school for each term on their application, or the student may have left one term blank
- Schools are expected to certify the student for the term(s) that the student selected your school, and schools will only be able to request payment for the term(s) for which you have certified to eligibility
- Schools will be able to see the school code on the Student Detail: Eligibility screen of the other school the student selected, and can check the list of participating schools to determine who it is

- Students will be in line to be awarded if at least one school certifies them as eligible
 - If neither school certifies the student, the student will not be considered in the first round of awarding
- To prevent any potential issues, we ask that schools complete all certifications as best you can with the information you have available so that no one who is potentially eligible is left uncertified

What's Next? Student Award Announcements

- Once the Certification process is completed by schools for the timely renewal applicants, ISAC will begin the award determination process
- The first round of awarding will prioritize those who are timely renewals with the lowest SAIs
- Once awarded, a scholarship award amount and date will display on the Student List Eligibility: View screen.
- The maximum \$7,500 amount a student may receive may be divided among all terms in the award year, if applicable.

ISAC Gift Assistance Programs

Monetary Award Program (MAP)

- Eligibility is based on financial need
- Covers tuition and mandatory fees at MAP-approved institutions
- 2024-25 maximum annual award is \$8,400

AIM HIGH Grant

- Awarded to students at the 12 Illinois public universities.
- Eligibility is based on financial need and other requirements established by each university.
- Provides renewal grant assistance toward a full-time undergraduate student's cost of attendance at the university



ISAC Gift Assistance Programs

Grant Programs for Dependents of Police, Fire, and Correctional Officers

- For spouse and children of Illinois Police, Fire or Correctional Officers killed in the line of duty
- Provides assistance for tuition and mandatory fees
- October 1 application deadline for full-year consideration

Displaced Energy Worker Dependent Transition Scholarship

- Intended for children of energy workers who lost employment due to reduced operations or closure of a fossil fuel power plant or coal mine
- Pays tuition and fee costs at public universities or community colleges for a period equal to one calendar year, including a summer term, for undergraduate or graduate study
- October 1 application deadline for full-year consideration



ISAC Teacher Programs

Minority Teachers of Illinois Scholarship Program

- Encourages academically talented minority students and/or qualified bilingual minority students to pursue careers as teachers at non-profit Illinois preschool, elementary and secondary schools
- o Maximum award amount is up to \$7,500 per year
- Can be used for tuition, fees, room and board or commuter charges

Golden Apple Scholars of Illinois Scholarship Program

- Encourages academically talented Illinois students, especially minority students, to pursue teaching careers, at high-need, hard-to-staff schools
- Scholars qualify for up to \$2,500 or \$5,000, depending on the year in the program

Special Education Teacher Tuition Waiver Program

- Purpose is to encourage current teachers and academically talented students to pursue careers in the area of Special Education
- Exempts recipients from the payment of tuition and mandatory fees for up to four calendar years at any of the public universities in Illinois
- o ISAC awards 250 waivers annually



ISAC's Military Programs

Illinois National Guard (ING) Grant

- o Eligible applicants are exempt from paying eligible tuition and certain fees
- Benefits are available at all Illinois 4-year public universities and public community colleges
- May be used at the undergraduate and graduate levels

Illinois Veteran Grant (IVG)

- Eligible applicants are exempt from paying tuition and mandatory fees
- Benefits are available at all Illinois 4-year public universities and public community colleges
- May be used at the undergraduate and graduate levels





Work Commitment

Gateways Scholarship recipients must make a commitment to work in the field of early care and education.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between INCCRRA and <Community College>
For Administration of the Gateways to Opportunity Scholarship Program

PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS:

- 1. <Community College> agrees to assist students with the financial aid process.
- <Community College> will arrange an invoice procedure, charging the Gateways Scholarship Program for approved
 coursework tuition of identified Gateways Scholarship recipients, and students any remaining tuition and fees.

Effective July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025

- <Community College> will allocate MAP Grants to Gateways Scholarship Program recipient(s) prior to submitting invoices to INCCRRA. The allocation of MAP Grants should be indicated on invoices to INCCRRA.
- Community College> will invoice the Gateways Scholarship Program at INCCRRA no later than 30 days from the end of each school term, and no later than June 30, 2025. The Gateways Scholarship Program cannot guarantee payment for invoices received later than 30 days from the end of each school term, and after June 30, 2025.

Gateways to Opportunity Scholarship Program:

- Gateways Scholarship Program will provide tuition payments for a maximum of 15 credit hours per year over 3 school terms (or 23 quarter hours over 4 school terms) for approved scholarship recipients.
- Gateways Scholarship Program will provide <Community College> with the names of approved scholarship recipients on an on-going basis.
- Gateways Scholarship Program will provide information each term on scholarship recipient's coursework approved for payment by the Program. Course authorizations will be sent via email unless specified otherwise.
- Gateways Scholarship Program will pay <Community College> a percentage, up to 100%, of the approved coursework tuition, not including fees and books.
- INCCRRA and <Community College> reserve the right to modify the terms of this Memo of Understanding at any | time
- INCCRRA and <Community College> may terminate this Memo of Understanding upon 30 days written notice to the other party.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
Between INCCRRA and School
For Administration of the Gateways to Opportunity Scholarship Program
Effective July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025

Participating Institutions:

 School> agrees to confirm a minimum of 55 semester (or 82 quarter) credit hours of transferable/ articulated coursework earned at the community college level for individuals applying for admission to the university, and acceptance in the Early Childhood/Child Development degree program.

Students with a conferred associate degree or who are currently enrolled as a Junior or higher at <School> are also eligible to apply for the Gateways to Opportunity Scholarship Program.

GOALS

City agencies collaborated to launch the Chicago Early Learning Workforce Scholarship (CELWS) initiative in 2018.







- CELWS aims to support Chicagoans and the current Chicago Early Learning workforce as they pursue coursework to earn a credential, degree, endorsement, or licensure to work with young children (birth through Pre-k) and families in Chicago Early Learning programs.
- The scholarship serves an important role in Chicago's efforts to expand access to early learning across the city and build a more robust workforce that can help Chicago expand high quality early learning programs.
- CELWS provides recipients with meaningful career pathways through partnerships with Institutions of Higher Education, which also offer students personalized supports as they navigate their desired course of study.



- How to Apply: Mid-January to February, applications can be completed on the Chicago Early Learning website. Once complete, the applicant will receive follow-up from Screening team (INCCRRA).
- Amount: The scholarship will serve as a "last dollar" scholarship, meaning it will cover everything that students' federal grants and other scholarships do not cover.
 - Tuition & eligible fees at 100%
 - Books up to \$250/course
- 3-year work commitment: Chicago Early Learning Workforce Scholarship recipients must commit to work in a Chicago Early Learning (CEL) Program (Community-based organization or CPS birth through Pre-K program) for a minimum of three years after completion of their degree or approved academic program.







- Q: How long may I participate in the Chicago Early Learning Workforce Scholarship program?
- A: CELWS will support awardees through Academic program/Degree attainment, contingent on funding, as long as students meet following requirements:
 - Maintain Good Standing and Continued Enrollment at your selected college/university
 - Earn a GPA of 2.0 or higher
 - Commit to work in a birth through Pre-K Chicago Early Learning Program (community-based organization or Chicago Public School) for three years after completion of the academic program or degree
- Q: How many credits can I be registered for?
- A: Maximum of 15 semester hours or 23 quarter hours per term
