2024-25 MAP

- Program Funding
 - The 2025 fiscal year (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025) appropriation for MAP is \$711,566,200
- Recompute Formula
 - Approved at the June 20, 2024 Commission Meeting
 - Same as 2024-25 Start-Up Formula (and 2023-24 Recompute Formula)
 - With some additional clarification that was necessary due to FAFSA Simplification, allowing for negative SAIs and parent contributions
 - Continues to use **FY22 tuition and fees** and **FY22 Pell** (as a student resource) in the formula
 - **Maximum award amount of \$8,400**
 - Living allowance \$5,200

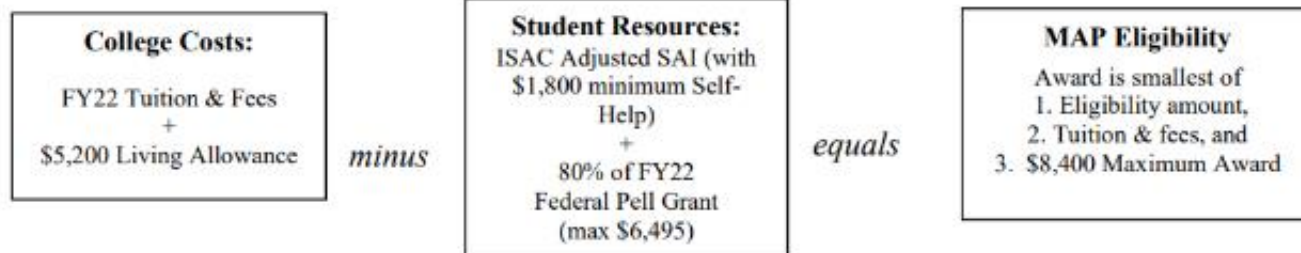

The MAP Eligibility Formula

The MAP formula determines whether a student is eligible for a grant and calculates the annual award amount. Figure One shows the basic formula, which uses the difference between a cost of attendance figure and student resources to calculate maximum eligibility. Costs include FY2022 tuition and mandatory fees and a \$5,200 living allowance.

Figure One: MAP Eligibility Formula



Resources include an inflated Student Aid Index (SAI) and a portion of FY2022 Pell grant eligibility. MAP eligibility is determined by subtracting resources from costs. If the difference is at least \$300 and other criteria are met, the student is eligible for a MAP grant. Eligibility is capped by the lowest of the eligibility amount from the formula, tuition and fees used in the costs, or the \$8,400 maximum award. Awards based on the eligibility amount are rounded in \$150 increments. Applicants with a Federal SAI of \$9,000 or more are not eligible for a MAP grant.

2024-25 MAP Recompute Formula Details

Resources

1. Use 80 percent of Pell Grant eligibility as determined by the 2021-22 Pell Grant Payment Schedule, which contains a \$6,495 maximum.
2. Calculate the ISAC-adjusted Student Aid Index (SAI) by inflating the SAI:
Adjusted Student Aid Index for Dependent Students:
If $SAI \leq 0$ set the following = 0 to calculate Adjusted SAI:
Parent Contribution (PC), Student Contribution from Income (SCI), Student Contribution from Assets (SCA)

If $SAI > 0$ and $PC < 0$ set $PC = 0$ to calculate Adjusted Parent Contribution
Adjustment Factor = $[(Parent\ Contribution/11,000) + 1.10]$ rounded to 2 decimal places
Adjusted PC = $PC \times Adjustment\ Factor$ (round to nearest whole number)
Student Contribution (SC) = $SCI + SCA$
Adjusted SC = highest of SC OR self-help expectation
Adjusted SAI = Adjusted PC + Adjusted SC

Adjusted Student Aid Index for Independent Students:
If Student Aid Index (SAI) < 0 , set $SAI = 0$ for calculation of Adjusted SAI
Adjustment Factor = $[SAI/11,000 + 1.10]$ rounded to 2 decimal places
Adjusted SAI = highest of $SAI \times Adjustment\ Factor$ (rounded to nearest whole number) OR self-help expectation
3. Use a minimum self-help expectation of \$1,800 for all students

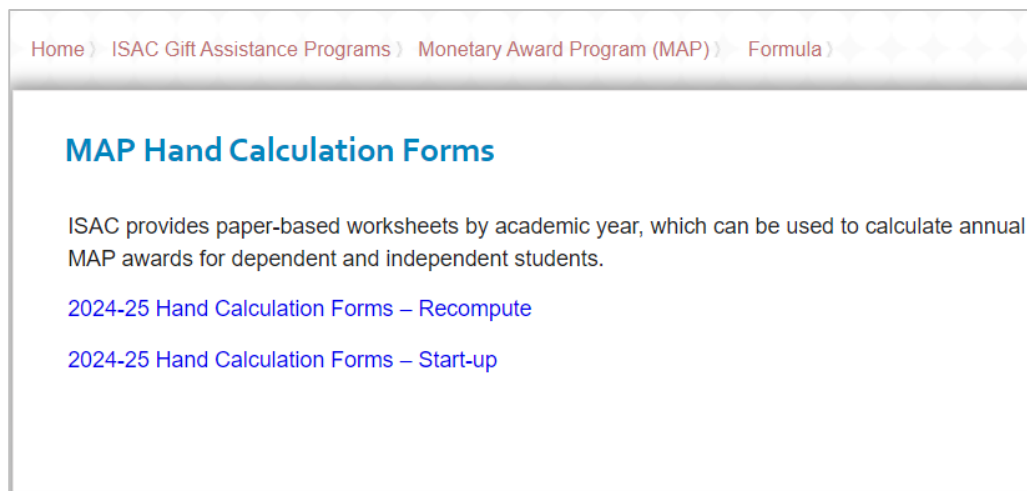
Award Amounts

- Set maximum award equal to lesser of \$8,400 or the tuition and mandatory fees specified in the budget
- Set the minimum award to \$300; round maximum eligibility in \$150 increments to calculate partial awards
- Applicants with a (Federal) SAI of \$9,000 or above are not eligible
- If determined necessary after first-term claims are received, either release some suspended applications and/or adjust claims to maximize claims without exceeding the appropriation
- Students with 135 or more MAP paid credit hours will not be eligible for MAP

2024-25 Recompute Formula

At its [June 20, 2024 meeting](#), the Illinois Student Assistance Commission approved a recompute formula – which is outlined in Table Four of [Agenda Item 6](#) – that is essentially the 2024-25 start-up formula, with some additional clarification that is necessary due to FAFSA Simplification allowing for negative SAIs and parent contribution:

Budget

1. Use 2021-22 reported tuition and fees at all institutions
2. Use one living allowance for all applicants, set to \$

Resources

1. Use 80 percent of Pell Grant eligibility as determined by the Department of Higher Education Schedule, which contains a \$6,495 maximum.
2. Calculate the ISAC-adjusted Student Aid Index

Adjusted Student Aid Index for Dependent Students

If $SAI \leq 0$ set the following = 0 to calculate Adjusted Student Aid Index (SAI).
Parent Contribution (PC), Student Contribution from Assets (SCA)

If $SAI > 0$ and $PC < 0$ set $PC = 0$ to calculate Adjusted Student Aid Index (SAI).
Adjustment Factor = $[(Parent\ Contribution / 11,000) + 1]$
Adjusted PC = $PC \times Adjustment\ Factor$ (round to nearest dollar)

Adjusted SAI = $Adjusted\ PC + Adjusted\ SC$

If Student Aid Index (SAI) < 0, set SAI = 0 for calculation.
Adjustment Factor = $[SAI / 11,000 + 1.10]$ rounded to nearest dollar
Adjusted SAI = highest of SAI x Adjustment Factor OR self-help expectation

3. Use a minimum self-help expectation of \$1,800 for independent students

Award Amounts

1. Set maximum award equal to lesser of \$8,400 or the budget. Set the minimum award to \$300; round maximum award to nearest dollar and calculate partial awards.
2. Applicants with a (Federal) SAI of \$9,000 or above are not eligible.
3. If determined necessary after first-term claims are received, either release some suspended applications and/or adjust claims to maximize claims without exceeding the appropriation.
4. Students with 135 or more MAP paid credit hours will not be eligible for MAP.

MAP 160-Byte File Layout Specifications

- The file layout for 2024-25 MAP processing is available in the Electronic Tools section of the E-Library
- For 2024-25, these data elements are no longer included on the file:
 - Student Social Security number (SSN)
 - Student Last Name (previously an optional field)
 - Original SSN
 - Name ID
- These Personally Identifiable Information (PII) data elements were removed to protect student identity when transmitting files between ISAC and colleges
- The student's **Person** Universally Unique Identifier (UUID) that is assigned to the student by the Department of Education (ED) by the FAFSA Processing System (FPS) replaces the SSN on the file
 - The Person UUID field is 36 characters in length, and the total number of characters being removed is also 36, so the length of the file will not change
 - The Person UUID will stay the same for the student across FAFSA cycles
 - ISAC will generate a Person UUID for Alternative Application applicants

Alternative Application Student Records

- The questions on the 2024-25 Alternative Application are consistent with the 2024-25 FAFSA and it collects all data elements needed to calculate an SAI
- Similar to an ISIR, the Alternative Application Student Record includes all application data elements
 - The order of the data in the file layout follows the order of the ISIR and the values are the same, unless otherwise noted
 - Available as a text file in Notepad
 - Using free Notepad++ app provides more user-friendly viewing
 - The Alternative Application Student Record School File Layout document provides details about field names, length of data fields, and start and end positions
 - Located in the Electronic Tools section of the E-Library at isac.org
- Creating/uploading Alternative Application Student Record files to colleges' internal systems is not required
 - Relevant student applicant data provided in GAP Access may be relied on to administer MAP for both FAFSA and Alternative Application applicants

Making Adjustments to Alternative Application Student Records

- A process is available in the MAP system that provides colleges with the ability to submit professional judgment adjustments and make corrections for Alternative Application student records
- Professional Judgment and Application Correction tabs are available on the Student Detail: Eligibility screen in the MAP system for Alt App records only
- Colleges may rely on the same policies and procedures they have in place for FAFSA applicants who have special or unusual circumstances
- During the update process, messaging will appear if data is removed from a required data field, and the user will not be able to proceed to the next page until required information has been entered
- Once all changes/updates have been entered, you must select a “Submit” button to complete the process

Illinois Residency Requirements for MAP

- MAP grant recipients must be residents of the State of Illinois and it is the college's responsibility to ensure that **all** MAP recipients meet the Illinois residency requirements
- For a dependent student to be considered an Illinois resident and eligible to receive a grant:
 - The parent of the dependent student who is required to complete the FAFSA must physically reside in Illinois and Illinois must be their true, fixed, and permanent home.
 - If Illinois becomes the parent's true, fixed, and permanent home after the initial FAFSA is filed, the student's and the parent's state of legal residence and permanent mailing address must be corrected to indicate Illinois on the FAFSA
- For an independent student to be considered a resident of Illinois they must have physically resided in Illinois (at the time of application), and must have resided for 12 continuous full months immediately **prior to the start of the academic year** for which assistance is requested and Illinois must be their true, fixed, and permanent home.
 - Example: An independent student attending an institution with an academic year starting on August 5, 2024, must have resided in Illinois from August 5, 2023 through August 4, 2024.

Illinois Residency Requirements for MAP

- It is the college's responsibility to verify any dependent student for whom there may be conflicting information pertaining to the parent's state of legal resident, as well as any student whose dependency status changes from "dependent" to "independent" during the award year.
- Applicants who cease to be Illinois residents after MAP award notification may complete the academic year with the awarded grant.
 - Example: If a dependent student's parent(s) moves out of state after completing the FAFSA and have received notification of MAP eligibility, the student remains eligible for MAP for the balance of that award year, assuming the student continues to meet all other eligibility requirements.
- If a school has conflicting information about an applicant's residency, the school must resolve this discrepancy prior to delivering MAP funds.
 - This requirement to resolve conflicting information is separate from the Federal Verification requirement and supersedes all verification rules.
- An institution is not required to verify residency if:
 - the applicant received payment of a MAP award during the previous academic year; or
 - the applicant was enrolled in an ISAC-approved MAP institution or an ISAC-approved Illinois high school for the preceding consecutive 12 months prior to the start of the academic year for which assistance is requested.

Illinois Residency Rule Amendment, Effective Beginning in 2024-25

From General Provisions, Section 2700.20 Definitions

"Resident of Illinois" –

A dependent student is a resident of Illinois if the parent of the dependent applicant, who is required by the instructions to complete the FAFSA or the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid, physically resides within the State of Illinois, and Illinois is the parent's true, fixed and permanent home.

An independent student is a resident of Illinois if the applicant physically resides within the State of Illinois (at the time of application), and has so resided for a period of 12 continuous, full months immediately prior to the start of the academic year for which assistance is requested and Illinois is their true, fixed and permanent home.

When an applicant does not qualify as a resident of Illinois under the preceding 2 paragraphs and the applicant is a member of the U.S. Armed Forces or a foreign missionary, or is the dependent or the spouse of an individual who is a member of the U.S. Armed Forces or a foreign missionary, or is a dependent student required to list an out-of-state parent contributor on the FAFSA form, then the applicant's residency shall be determined in accordance with the following:

...

An applicant who is a dependent student and physically resides in the State of Illinois with a parent but is required to list an out-of-state parent contributor on the FAFSA form may be considered a Resident of Illinois for the purpose of State financial aid programs. See Section 2700.50(e)(3).

Illinois Residency Rule Amendment, Effective Beginning in 2024-25

From General Provisions, 2700.50(a)(3) – Determining Applicant Eligibility

3) If the institution has information that a dependent student physically resides with a parent within the State of Illinois, but the parent contributor listed on the FAFSA physically resides in another state, the institution shall review the applicant's residency eligibility for ISAC gift assistance programs to determine whether it should be based on the Illinois resident parent.

A) The institution will make this determination on a case-by-case basis upon confirming that the dependent student and Illinois parent reside in the State as evidenced by documentation as outlined in subsection (e)(4).

B) The institution shall notify ISAC of the determination.

C) A student's maximum annual MAP award amount shall be based on the need analysis calculation using the data of the parent who is required to provide financial information on the FAFSA or Alternative Application, according to the instructions provided on the respective applications.

Procedures to Implement Residency Amendment

- A check-box will be available in the MAP system when payment processing begins to allow schools to override the residency issue for students who have a disqualify code due to an out-of-state parent contributor
- For FTP payment processing, a Dependent Residency Override field is being added to the file layout to provide a Y indicator, if needed

In addition to the data elements that are required to determine a student's Student Aid Index (SAI), there are critical data elements that must be reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) and appear on the FAFSA Submission Summary and/or Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) in order for ISAC to determine a student's eligibility for the Monetary Award Program (MAP).

NOTE: in some instances, Illinois undocumented students who are not eligible for federal financial aid (and do not file the FAFSA) may apply for a MAP grant using the [Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid](#), which is patterned after the FAFSA. For these students to be considered for a MAP grant, the Alternative Application questions that correspond to the below-referenced FAFSA critical items must be completed.

If any one of the following items on the FAFSA, FAFSA Submission Summary or Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) is blank, incomplete or incorrect, ISAC will not be able to determine a student's MAP eligibility. When counseling students on how to properly complete the FAFSA, please review these critical items to ensure students are providing the information necessary for MAP award consideration. If any corrections are needed, they must be made through the FAFSA Processing System (FPS) to update a student's record for calculation of MAP eligibility.

2024-25 MAP Payment Processing

- Will be available later this month
- MAP payment requests are expected to be submitted on correct ISIR transactions
 - ISAC is aware that many initial 2024-25 ISIRs had various errors due to ED issues, and that initial award offers may have been made based on those, however, MAP payment requests should be submitted on corrected ISIR transactions
 - Based on MAP rules and ISAC's operational procedures:
 - Colleges are expected to notify students if, as the result of a reprocessed ISIR, a student's MAP award amount changes or a student loses eligibility
 - Institutions are expected to communicate changes and adjustments to the student
 - A student's MAP claim should be submitted to ISAC on a valid, correct ISIR
 - This guidance applies not just to ISIRs reprocessed by the U.S. Department of Education (ED), but for any subsequent ISIR transactions generated due to school or student corrections throughout the award year
 - MAP Award Announcements: isac.org/isac-gift-assistance-programs/map/map-award-announcements/
- From MAP rules:
 - Section 2735.30 Program Procedures -- h) Applicants are informed that they are MAP recipients on the basis of application data supplied to ISAC. ISAC will recalculate awards for those applicants whose applications are not in basic agreement with their financial records, after receipt of corrected data. All announced MAP recipients are subject to verification.
 - Section 2735.40 Institutional Procedures -- h) The institution shall announce MAP eligibility, including the estimated award amount, using ISAC-provided award notification language. The institution shall also provide notification to affected students of any change in award eligibility that may occur during the academic year.

FAFSA/MAP Issues

- ISAC is aware of an issue going on with students who, on their FAFSA, incorrectly marked that they have “received a bachelor’s degree” and later went back into their FAFSA to correct it.
- The issue is that a Comment Code 150 is being indicated on the corrected ISIR and still making the student ineligible for MAP Grant.
- ISAC is aware of the issue and working on a way to resolve it

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®)

The [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA®\)](#) serves as the application for the MAP grant. Each student who reports Illinois as their state of legal residence automatically applies for MAP when completing the FAFSA annually. The FAFSA should be completed as soon as possible after it becomes available* for the academic year for which assistance is being requested. Returning MAP recipients (i.e., students who received MAP funds during the prior academic year and continue to meet all [eligibility requirements](#)) who submit their FAFSAs by that academic year's priority deadline date (set by ISAC annually) will receive priority access to appropriated MAP funds.

ISAC Operational Updates

2024-25 ISAC Programs

- **Minority Teachers of Illinois (MTI) Scholarship Program**
 - Colleges may now certify 2024-25 eligibility for students in the MTI system in GAP Access
 - There have been no functional or operational changes made to the certification process
 - All certification records available in the MTI system must be completed, regardless of whether the college certifies a student as eligible or ineligible
- **Illinois Special Education Teacher Tuition Waiver (SETTW) Program**
 - Effective August 6, 2024, functionality to certify eligibility for 2024-25 SETTW newly-awarded students – as well as transfer students – is available in the SETTW system
 - E-mails have been sent to institutions with instructions to certify each student's eligibility via the SETTW system within 60 days of the date on which the e-mail is received
- **Illinois National Guard (ING) Grant**
 - Colleges may access eligibility data in the ING Grant system in GAP Access
 - Benefit request functionality for fall term will be available this week
- **Illinois Veteran Grant (IVG)**
 - Benefit request functionality for summer fall term will be available this week

ISAC Program Reviews Extended

- Temporary pause of ISAC programs reviews extended through September 30, 2024 – results of ED extending their routine program reviews through September 2024
 - Following guidance provided by the U.S. Department of Education in a July 30, 2024, electronic announcement (GENERAL-24-96), which includes an extension of the previously-announced pause of program reviews, ISAC has also extended (through September 30, 2024) the temporary pause of new routine program reviews and responses, reports or requests for additional documentation for schools currently undergoing a review. Schools are encouraged to continue working with ISAC's Program Review team
