# 2024-25 Monetary Award Program (MAP)

- Payment processing for the Fall term began on August 28
  - Schools may submit payment requests through the MAP system in GAP Access or via the File Transfer Protocol process
- The Fall term claim deadline date is Friday, December 6, 2024
  - See the August 28 e-Message for more details

- ISAC suspended the announcement of 2024-25 MAP grants for all students whose initial 2024-25 FAFSA or Alternative Application was received on or after August 21, 2024
  - MAP records in suspense status will be indicated by a MAP Suspend Code of "S" in the MAP system and in the MAP Eligibility File Extraction


### 2024-25 MAP Payment Processing

#### What's New for 2024-25 Payment Processing?

- A Dependent Residency Override function has been added to the MAP payment request process
  - This may be used when a school determines that a dependent student meets the Illinois residency requirement as defined in the recently-amended ISAC Administrative Rules for the 2024-25 academic year
  - The rule amendment is intended to address situations where a dependent student who is an Illinois resident resides with a parent who is also an Illinois resident, but the student was required to list an out-of-state parent contributor on the FAFSA
- For dependent students who have answered questions on the FAFSA or Alternative Application that result in them being considered provisionally independent, a "Z" code will be provided on the student record for dependency status
  - The "Z" code indicates that either a professional judgment must be done to determine if a dependency override is appropriate or parental data must be provided so that the correct dependency status can be determined



# 2024-25 MAP Payment Processing: Dependent Residency Override



Checking the box will override the MAP Disqualify code that will appear in the MAP system for dependent students whose parent contributor does not report Illinois as their state of residence on the FAFSA or Alt App/



Because the student record has a Disqualify code of 1, the school will also need to check the checkboxes for Include Ineligible and Disqualify when submitting the payment request.



Field #15 may be used to provide a Dependent Residency Override when submitting payment claims via FTP. The field should be populated with a **Y** to provide the override as part of the payment request process.

# **2024-25 MAP Payment Processing:** Certificate Programs

- To request MAP payment for a student in an eligible certificate program, report the number of credit-based hours in which the student is enrolled for the term.
  - If the student is enrolled in additional coursework, the number of enrollment hours reported should be the combination of the certificate program hours and other coursework the student may be enrolled in.
- When submitting a MAP payment request for a student in a certificate program, the Short-Term Certificate Program indicator should be checked in the MAP system.

 The certificate box should be checked even if the hours are mixed (a combination of traditional and certificate program courses).

- Help text is provided to clarify when the indicator should be checked.
- For payment requests submitted via File Transfer Protocol, a "Y" indicator should be provided in Field #24 in the FTP file, per the file specifications.

Check this box if some or all of the term MAP award will be used for a credit-based Occupational or Career and Technical Certificate program at a public institution, and it is a program that is not currently eligible for federal Title IV financial aid.





# 2024-25 MAP Payment Processing: Certificate Programs

- If requesting payment in the MAP system in GAP Access, the indicator can be provided on the:
  - Student Payment Detail screen for individual reporting
  - Input Enrollment screen for batch reporting, will apply to all students entered on the screen

o Payment Generation screen - for batch processing; will apply to all students selected (and

saved) on the Student Payment List









### **MAP Payment Processing Reminders**

- If a payment request has been submitted for a term and the MAP code needs to be corrected or updated:
  - First, cancel the original request (just as you would do a cancellation for other reasons, such as a withdrawal)
  - Once the cancellation has processed, submit a new request using the alternate budget code
- This can be done in GAP Access in the MAP system for individual adjustments to a student's record or it may be done using FTP
  - In either case, this would be a two-step process of cancelling the request and letting it process, and then submitting a new request after the cancellation has processed.
- Keep in mind claim deadline dates when making this kind of adjustment to ensure plenty of time to cancel and then submit a new claim



## **MAP Payment Processing Reminders**

- MAP payment requests are expected to be submitted on correct ISIR transactions
- Based on MAP rules and ISAC's operational procedures:
  - Colleges are expected to notify students if, as the result of a reprocessed ISIR, a student's MAP award amount changes or a student loses eligibility
  - Institutions are expected to communicate changes and adjustments to the student
  - A student's MAP claim should be submitted to ISAC on a valid, correct ISIR
  - This guidance applies not just to ISIRs reprocessed by the U.S.
     Department of Education (ED), but for any subsequent ISIR transactions generated due to school or student corrections throughout the award year

#### Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®)

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) serves as the application for the MAP grant. Each student who reports Illinois as their state of legal residence automatically applies for MAP when completing the FAFSA annually. The FAFSA should be completed as soon as possible after it becomes available\* for the academic year for which assistance is being requested. Returning MAP recipients (i.e., students who received MAP funds during the prior academic year and continue to meet all eligibility requirements) who submit their FAFSAs by that academic year's priority deadline date (set by ISAC annually) will receive priority access to appropriated MAP funds.

#### 2024-25 ECACE Scholarship Program

#### **Program Overview**

- The program is intended for those who are currently working or have worked in early childhood education and are seeking additional credentials and/or a degree
- Must be attending a public or non-profit private 2- or 4-year Gateways-entitled and Early Childhood Access Consortium for Equity member institution as an undergraduate level student
- The scholarship may be used for any cost of attendance component, such as tuition, fees, room and board charges or commuter allowances
- Intended to be last payer, after other financial aid has been provided
- Recipients are expected to continue or return to teaching or direct services in the early childhood care and education field in Illinois after completion of their program of study
- Applicants are prioritized for awarding based on their Student Aid Index (SAI), from lowest to highest



#### **ECACE Scholarship Program**

#### What's New for 2024-25?

- The program is now funded by the State of Illinois rather than with federal funding
- Appropriation is \$5 million for Fiscal Year 2025 (2024-25 award year)
- The maximum annual award amount a student may receive is \$7,500
- Graduate students are not eligible for the scholarship
- ECACE will only be available for the regular school year terms (fall, winter and spring); it will not be available for the summer term
- 2024-25 application is no longer available



#### 2024-25 ECACE

#### **What's Currently Happening? Student Awards**

- Colleges have completed the certification process for timely renewal applicants and awarding was done on Tuesday, September 24
- Awarding prioritization was based on:
  - An applicant's renewal status
    - Renewal status means that the student was paid ECACE Scholarship benefits in the previous 2023-24 award year
  - The application receipt date
  - The applicant's Student Aid Index (SAI)
    - Awarding to those with the lowest (-1500) SAIs
- All 2024-25 ECACE Scholarships were awarded to timely renewal applicants with an SAI of -1500
  - Funding was not sufficient to award to all applicants who meet this criteria
- Colleges are now able to submit payment requests to ISAC on behalf of students who have been awarded a scholarship



#### 2024-25 ECACE

#### What's Currently Happening? Notifications and Communication

- Students are being sent notifications from ISAC regarding their award
  - Emails are being sent first, followed by letters via US Mail
  - A Notice of Insufficient Funding will be sent to eligible students unable to receive an award due to funding limitations
- An e-message with details about awarding and payment processing has been sent to financial aid administrators at the colleges
  - In addition, ISAC has sent a letter to college presidents, chancellors, and chief student service officers encouraging institutions to exercise flexibility to protect those students who may not have received an ECACE scholarship from academic or financial penalties
  - A sample of the letter is available via the ECACE e-message that was sent to the colleges



### 2024-25 ECACE Payment Process

- The maximum award amount that may be claimed during the academic year is populated in the "Max Annual Award Amount" field of the ECACE system
- The 2024-25 ECACE Scholarship maximum annual award is \$7,500
- There are no term award amount limits
  - Colleges must determine the term award amount(s) based on other financial aid the student is receiving
- ECACE Scholarship is last payer, and can be used for any cost of attendance component
- Schools need to indicate if a student is not eligible for payment on a per-term basis




### 2024-25 ECACE Payment Process

- Submitting claims is a two-step process, which involves *generating* the request and then *submitting* the request
- By submitting a payment request to ISAC, a college is confirming that the student is enrolled and continues to meet all eligibility criteria
- Payment results are available in the ECACE system each morning
- A Payment Result Summary and Invoice Detail Report can be viewed or printed by selecting the Report tab in the ECACE system the day after a payment request has been processed
- The disbursement of funds is processed by the State Comptroller's Office



#### 2024-25 ECACE Student Payment: View Screen


- The Student Payment List: View is accessed by selecting the Payment tab
- The following functions are available on the Student Payment List: View screen: View, Filter, Sort, Columns, Payment Request Entry, and Submit Payment Requests





#### 2024-25 ECACE Student Detail: Payments Screen

This screen is accessed by clicking on the **dollar sign icon** on the **Student Payment List: View** screen or by selecting the **Payment** tab from the **Student List Eligibility: View** screen



### 2024-25 ECACE Ineligible Reasons

- The ECACE system will de-obligate/remove a student's full award if one of the following Ineligible reasons is selected during payment processing:
  - Not a US citizen/eligible non-citizen
  - Not a HS grad/no GED
  - Student is not accepting ECACE Scholarship
- The system will not remove the award if any of the following Ineligible reasons is selected during payment processing:
  - Defaulted student loan
  - Not making satisfactory academic progress
  - No remaining unmet cost
  - Enrolled less than 3 credit hours
  - Not pursuing an early childhood education major
  - Not enrolled this term




#### 2024-25 ECACE Submit Payment Requests Screen

- The Submit Payment Requests screen allows you to submit payment requests to ISAC for processing
- The payment request records will be submitted based on the Term selected
- After payment requests have been submitted by clicking on the Submit button, a message will be displayed indicating how many payment requests were submitted

# 2024-25 Minority Teachers of Illinois (MTI) Scholarship Program

- Awarding has begun and schools may submit Fall term (first-term) payment requests (claims) through the MTI system in GAP Access
- Award notifications were sent to eligible students by ISAC
- To be considered timely, first-term payment requests must be submitted on or before Tuesday, December 31, 2024
- Colleges are encouraged to continue certifying eligibility on a daily basis throughout the year, to ensure that your students will be included in all future rounds of awarding that may take place
- All certification records available in the MTI system should be completed, regardless of whether the college certifies a student as eligible or ineligible and regardless of whether the student is currently enrolled



# 2024-25 Minority Teachers of Illinois (MTI) Scholarship Program

- Online application remains available.
  - Priority consideration date was March 31, 2024 to be considered Timely
- Each institution that participates in the MTI Scholarship Program must:
  - Host an annual information session about the program for teacher candidates of color
  - In an effort to facilitate on-time completion of each student's educator preparation program, require that all program recipients enrolled at the institution meet with an academic advisor at least once per academic level.



# 2024-25 Illinois Special Education Teacher Tuition Waiver (SETTW) Program

- Tuition waivers have been awarded and students have been notified
- Schools may now complete the tuition waiver process
  - This is done by certifying eligibility in GAP Access for both newly-awarded students and transfer students in the SETTW system within GAP Access
- If a qualified applicant is eligible for both the SETTW and the MAP grant, the SETTW award must be used first
- Each of the public universities with students who were awarded 2024-25 tuition waivers have been sent an e-mail from ISAC
  - Colleges are asked to certify each student's eligibility within 60 days of the date on which the e-mail is received
    - This allows ISAC to award unused waivers to another student as soon as possible
  - If subsequent 2024-25 SETTW awards are announced, ISAC will send similar e-mail messages to impacted institutions



### 2024-25 Golden Apple (GA) Scholars

- Fall term (first-term) payment requests are now being accepted online through the Golden Apple system in GAP Access
- To be considered timely, first-term payment requests must be submitted on or before Tuesday, December 31, 2024
- The Annual Award field in the GA system shows the Annual Award Amount To Date
  - The Golden Apple Foundation only certifies/awards a student for one term at a time
    - For example: If it is the beginning of the Fall term, the 'Annual Award Amount To Date' is reflecting the Fall term amount only, not the entire year award
    - If the same student is certified/awarded for Spring, you will see an increase in the 'Annual Award Amount To Date' to include the Spring award




# Dual-Awarding Students Eligible for SETTW, MTI and/or Golden Apple


- If a student qualifies for SETTW, MTI and/or Golden Apple in the same award year, the student must choose which program they would like to use.
  - o A student cannot receive the benefits of two of these programs in the same award year.
  - o ISAC will send the student a letter asking them to choose which program they want to accept.
  - These letters include a deadline date to return the form.
  - The ECACE Scholarship may be used with one of these programs, and ECACE would be last payer
- If a student decides to change which program benefit, he/she wants to receive:
  - First confirm that the student has been awarded the other program before cancelling a payment request/claim that may have already been made.
    - For example, make sure that the student was awarded funds for MTI before cancelling a payment request for Golden Apple.
- Program teaching obligations:
  - o SETTW requires two-year teaching commitment.
  - Golden Apple requires a five-year teaching commitment.
  - MTI has a one-year teaching commitment for each year that the scholarship is received.


#### Ways to View Students Awarded GA, SETTW & MTI












#### **Dual-Awarding Students with MTI & Golden Apple**




#### 2024-25 Nursing Education Scholarships (NES)

- The NES certification process will be available in the NES system in GAP Access the week of September 30
  - Certification must take place prior to awarding and is completed for the academic year (rather than by term)
  - All certification records must be completed, regardless of whether the college certifies a student as eligible or ineligible
  - As part of certification, colleges must provide:
    - Program of Study
    - Anticipated Graduation Date
    - Student Aid Index (SAI)
    - Information regarding current credentials (is student pursuing a higher degree)
    - Ineligible reason, if applicable
  - Certification data is needed for awarding prioritization when funding isn't sufficient for all applicants
  - Once a certification record has been saved and submitted, it can no longer be edited by the school
    - Contact School Services if changes are needed

### 2024-25 NES Awarding

- Scholarships will first be awarded to renewal applicants who continue to meet all of the program's eligibility requirements.
- An applicant is considered a renewal applicant for the program if they received NES funds during the previous academic program
- If funds remain after all qualified renewal applicants have been awarded, then awards will be made to eligible new applicants according to the degree type being sought.
  - NES Awarding Chart: <u>isac.org/isac-gift-assistance-programs/NESP/awarding.html</u>
- If a recipient completed a certificate, diploma or degree program for which they received scholarship assistance, and they are now pursuing a higher level of education:
  - They will be considered a new applicant, and
  - Their maximum available years of assistance will be based on the maximum for the new degree being sought.
    - For example, a recipient now pursuing a baccalaureate degree after receiving assistance for an associate degree; the number of years of assistance previously received do not count toward the new maximum.



# 2024-25 NES Awarding

 The certificate, diploma or degree being pursued by the student determines the NES maximum award amount and the maximum number of years the award may be received, and award amounts differ by type of college.

#### 2024-25 NES maximum annual award amount is either \$9,023 or \$18,204

## FY25 Funding for IVG & ING Grant programs

- ISAC's FY25 state appropriation includes funding of \$6 million to reimburse public universities for tuition and fees that are waived on behalf of students receiving Illinois Veteran Grants and Illinois National Guard Grants.
- The state's FY25 budget also included a little more than \$4.2 million for the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) to reimburse Illinois community colleges for the costs associated with the IVG and ING Grant programs.
- ISAC is currently working on the details for how the funds will be disbursed to schools and will provide more information once it becomes available.



### 2024-25 Illinois National Guard (ING) Grant

- Illinois National Guard (ING) Grant
  - Benefit usage data reporting for the Fall term 2024 must be submitted on or before Tuesday, December 31, 2024 to be considered timely.

#### Reminders:

- Students must re-apply each year
- There are no longer term deadline dates by which applications must be submitted each term
- Applications must be received by ISAC in time for eligibility to be determined
- The applicant will need to notify the college about their eligibility no later than the last scheduled day of classes for the first-term for which the student wants to receive benefits
- Members of the Illinois National Guard who have served at least 10 years in the Guard may be eligible to receive up to 180 Units (6 years) of eligibility for the ING Grant.



# 2024-25 Illinois Veteran Grant (IVG)

- Illinois Veteran Grant (IVG)
  - Benefit usage data reporting for the Summer and Fall terms 2024 is now available
    - Benefit usage data reporting for the Summer term must be submitted on or before Monday, September 30, 2024 to be considered timely
    - Benefit usage data reporting for the Fall term 2024 must be submitted on or before Tuesday, December 31, 2024 to be considered timely
  - Application can be submitted any time during the academic year.
  - Students do not need to reapply each year only once to establish eligibility.
  - Applications must be received by ISAC allowing sufficient time to complete processing and for applicant to notify college about their eligibility prior to the last scheduled day of classes in the term for which a grant is requested.



# 2024-25 Illinois Graduate and Retain our Workforce (iGROW) Tech Scholarship Program

- FY25 budget includes \$2 million for iGROW
- The program was designed to recruit and retain individuals to work in technology jobs that have a high demand for new employees
- The program gives priority to renewal applicants, students who demonstrate academic excellence, students who demonstrate financial need, and minority students
- Scholarships will pay up to \$7,500 for tuition and fees, and room and board costs for each continuous academic year recipients meet eligibility requirements at Illinois public universities



### 2024-25 iGROW Tech Scholarship Program

- To be eligible:
  - be a U.S. citizen or an eligible non-citizen or meet the "undocumented student" criteria of the RISE Act
  - be an Illinois resident
  - have graduated from high school or have received a State of Illinois High School Diploma and have maintained a cumulative grade point average of no less than 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
  - pursue or intend to pursue a qualifying degree;
    - computer information sciences
    - information technology
    - information science
    - computer science
    - computer systems networking and telecommunications
    - computer and information systems security or information assurance, including cybersecurity; or management information systems
  - be enrolled at least a half-time basis, in a course of study necessary to secure a qualifying associate or bachelor's degree
  - o maintain satisfactory academic progress, as determined by your college



### 2024-25 iGROW Tech Scholarship Program


- The online application is available in the ISAC Student Portal
- The priority application consideration date is November 30, 2024
- To be considered for the scholarship, an applicant will need to complete an Application/Work Agreement/Promissory Note
  - o Must submit a FAFSA or Alternative Application for the same year
- By receiving this scholarship, the recipient agrees to work in Illinois in a qualifying job for a period of no less than one year, or any portion of a year of scholarship assistance
- The recipient must begin employment with an employer in Illinois that is directly related to the field of study that qualified them for assistance under this program within one year following completion of the program
- If the commitment is not fulfilled, the scholarship converts to a loan, plus interest, and the entire amount received must be repaid

- Application is available for students to download and print
  - Applicants must reapply each year
- The application deadline date for full-year consideration is
   October 1, 2024
- Other application deadline dates for partial-year consideration are:
  - March 1, 2025 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester (2<sup>nd</sup>/3rdQuarter) and Summer Term consideration
  - June 15, 2025 Summer term only consideration
- Qualified applicants will be sent a Notice of Eligibility from ISAC
  - If application is incomplete, a Notice of Incomplete Application will be sent to the applicant
- A Certification of Enrollment for Payment roster will be sent to schools soon after the Fall term application deadline date



# 2024-25 Displaced Energy Worker Dependent Transition Scholarship

- The online application is available in the ISAC Student Portal
- The application deadline date for full-year consideration is
   October 1, 2024
- Other application deadline dates for partial-year consideration are:
  - March 1, 2025 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester (2<sup>nd</sup>/3rdQuarter) and Summer Term consideration
  - June 15, 2025 Summer term only consideration
- A Certification of Enrollment for Payment roster will be sent to schools soon after the Fall term application deadline date




# 2024-25 Grant Program for Exonerees

#### 2024-25 Administrative Rule Amendments

#### Rule amendment to "Resident of Illinois" definition for 2024-25

#### Section 2700.20 Definitions

"Resident of Illinois" -

A dependent student is a resident of Illinois if the parent of the dependent applicant, who is required by the instructions to complete the FAFSA or the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid, physically resides within the State of Illinois, and Illinois is the parent's true, fixed and permanent home.

An independent student is a resident of Illinois if the applicant physically resides within the State of Illinois (at the time of application) and has so resided for a period of 12 continuous, full months immediately prior to the start of the academic year for which assistance is requested and Illinois is their true, fixed and permanent home.

When an applicant does not qualify as a resident of Illinois under the preceding 2 paragraphs and the applicant is a member of the U.S. Armed Forces or a foreign missionary, or is the dependent or the spouse of an individual who is a member of the U.S. Armed Forces or a foreign missionary, or is a dependent student required to list an out-of-state parent contributor on the FAFSA form, then the applicant's residency shall be determined in accordance with the following:

An applicant who is a dependent student and physically resides in the State of Illinois with a parent but is required to list an out-of-state parent contributor on the FAFSA form may be considered a Resident of Illinois for the purpose of State financial aid programs. See Section 2700.50(e)(3).




#### 2024-25 Administrative Rule Amendments

Rule amendment to "Resident of Illinois" definition for 2024-25

- Section 2700.50(a)(3) Determining Applicant Eligibility
  - 3) If the institution has information that a dependent student physically resides with a parent within the State of Illinois, but the parent contributor listed on the FAFSA physically resides in another state, the institution shall review the applicant's residency eligibility for ISAC gift assistance programs to determine whether it should be based on the Illinois resident parent.
    - A) The institution will make this determination on a case-by-case basis upon confirming that the dependent student and Illinois parent reside in the State as evidenced by documentation as outlined in subsection (e)(4).
    - B) The institution shall notify ISAC of the determination.
    - C) A student's maximum annual MAP award amount shall be based on the need analysis calculation using the data of the parent who is required to provide financial information on the FAFSA or Alternative Application, according to the instructions provided on the respective applications.





- The 2025-26 MAP Start-Up Formula was approved at the September 19, 2024, Commission Meeting
  - FY26 Start-up formula remains the same as FY25 Recompute formula:
    - 2021-22 reported tuition and fees
    - the 2021-22 Pell Grant Payment Schedule
    - a \$5,200 living allowance
    - an \$8,400 maximum award
