

All Things MAP: **An Operational Update** on the 2024-25 and 2025-26 **Monetary Award Program**

2024-25 Award Year Fiscal Year (FY) 2025



2024-25 Monetary Award Program (MAP)

- Initial FY2025 Recompute Formula
 - Was approved at the June 2024 Commission Meeting
 - Maximum award amount was \$8,400
- ISAC suspended the announcement of 2024-25 MAP grants for all students whose initial 2024-25 FAFSA or Alternative Application was received on or after August 21, 2024
- Fall term claim deadline date was Friday, December 6, 2024
 - Term 1 enrollment and fall claim rates were much higher than expected
- On December 17, ISAC announced that a 4% reduction factor would need to be applied to the 2024-25 maximum annual award amount to stay within the FY25 appropriation
 - The reduction was only applied to second semester and second/third quarter claims; fall term award amounts were not reduced
 - For semester institutions, the maximum eligible award amount for the spring term was reduced by 8%
 - For quarter institutions, the maximum eligible award amount for both second and third quarters was reduced by 6%



2024-25 MAP

- Mid-Year Recompute
 - Reduces the maximum annual award amount of \$8400 by 4%
 - $8400 \times .96 = 8064$
- The reduction was implemented in the MAP system and recalculated awards provided to colleges on December 23
 - The award amounts displaying in the MAP system continue to show the original maximum eligible amount for the fall term
 - To account for the reduction that was not applied to the fall term, a higher percentage was used to reduce original second and third term eligibility amounts
- Payment processing for Term 2 was made available on January 2
 - The claim deadline date for Term 2 (spring semester/winter quarter) is Friday, April 4

FAQs: Reduction in 2024-25 MAP Awards

The Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) is the state agency that manages the Monetary Award Program (MAP) grant, a need-based scholarship that helps Illinois students pay for school. The state's General Assembly and Governor determine how much funding the program can use in a year, and ISAC operates the program.

I got a message from my school that my MAP grant is being reduced. What does that mean?

It means that in the spring semester (or winter and spring terms at quarter schools), your MAP award
will be less than originally estimated, because the total amount of financial aid awarded through the
MAP for the 2024-2025 academic year is being reduced.

Why are you reducing awards mid-year?

- MAP grants come through ISAC, and the amount the agency can award each year is based on the level
 of funding provided by the state. When you see the MAP award in your financial aid offer, it is
 an estimated award.
- This fall, many more students who are eligible for MAP grants enrolled than was expected.
- Since the number of students using a MAP grant is much higher than expected, ISAC needs to reduce
 the size of MAP grants to ensure that the available funding can support all of the eligible students
 continuing to receive MAP grants for the rest of the academic year.

How much money will I get from my MAP award?

 Depending on the size of your MAP grant, the reduction could range from as little as \$12 to as much as \$336.

Am I going to have to pay back money I received for the fall term?

- No! You won't need to pay back any of the MAP grant funds you've already received for the fall term
 due to the reduction in your annual award amount.
- However, your financial aid for the 2025 spring semester (or winter and spring quarters) will be somewhat less than the estimate that may have been included in your original financial aid package.
 This means your tuition bill for those terms may be slightly higher than expected.

Who should I ask or where can I go if I have questions?

- Your school's financial aid office: They can provide specific details about how this change affects you.

Semester Example

- Spring semester award, reduced by 8%
 - $_{\circ}$ Original eligible term amount x .92 (8%) = new max eligible term amount, based on 15-hour enrollment
 - 4200 x .92 = 3864
 - 1500 x .92 = 1380
- Award amounts for less than full-time (15 hour) enrollment
 - Maximum eligible term award amount times the number of hours enrolled, divided by 15; student receives 1/15 of the award amount for each hour enrolled
 - 3864 x 12/15 = 46,368/15 = 3091.20
 - > At "no cents" schools, truncate result to whole number: award amount is \$3091
 - > At "cents" schools, truncate result to two decimal places: award amount is: \$3091.20



MAP Payment Processing Reminders

- Colleges can continue to make adjustments to previously-submitted fall term claims (e.g. to change enrollment hours, adjust amounts, etc).
 - Initial fall term claims and upward adjustment amounts for timely fall claims will be considered a late claim now that the fall term claim deadline has passed
 - It's important that colleges make downward adjustments as fall term reconciliation is completed, rather than wait until year-end
 - Due to the offset process, actual funds do not have to be returned to ISAC until year-end, however, adjustments should be made in the MAP system as soon as possible
 - > This assists ISAC with monitoring actual enrollment and claim rates and provides more accurate information for projections
- We do not recommend that schools submit adjustments to change MAP codes for the fall term if it will result in a claim being considered late and unable to be paid
 - In order to change MAP codes, the original request must first be cancelled and then a new request submitted
 - Any new fall term requests would now be late
 - o Downward adjustments can be made, as needed



Illinois Residency Requirements for MAP

- MAP grant recipients must be residents of the State of Illinois and it is the college's responsibility to ensure that all MAP recipients meet the Illinois residency requirements
- For a dependent student to be considered an Illinois resident and eligible to receive a grant:
 - The parent of the dependent student who is required to complete the FAFSA must physically reside in Illinois and Illinois must be their true, fixed, and permanent home.
 - If Illinois becomes the parent's true, fixed, and permanent home after the initial FAFSA is filed, the student's and the parent's state of legal residence and permanent mailing address must be corrected to indicate Illinois on the FAFSA
- For an independent student to be considered a resident of Illinois they must have physically resided in Illinois (at the time of application), and must have resided for 12 continuous full months immediately prior to the start of the academic year for which assistance is requested and Illinois must be their true, fixed, and permanent home.
 - Example: An independent student attending an institution with an academic year starting on August 5, 2024, must have resided in Illinois from August 5, 2023 through August 4, 2024.



Illinois Residency Requirements for MAP

- It is the college's responsibility to verify any dependent student for whom there
 may be conflicting information pertaining to the parent's state of legal resident, as
 well as any student whose dependency status changes from "dependent" to
 "independent" during the award year.
- Applicants who cease to be Illinois residents after MAP award notification may complete the academic year with the awarded grant.
 - Example: If a dependent student's parent(s) moves out of state after completing the FAFSA and have received notification of MAP eligibility, the student remains eligible for MAP for the balance of that award year, assuming the student continues to meet all other eligibility requirements.
- If a school has conflicting information about an applicant's residency, the school must resolve this discrepancy prior to delivering MAP funds.
 - This requirement to resolve conflicting information is separate from the Federal Verification requirement and supersedes all verification rules.
- An institution is not required to collect documentation to verify residency if:
 - · the applicant received payment of a MAP award during the previous academic year; or
 - the applicant was enrolled in an ISAC-approved MAP institution or an ISAC-approved Illinois high school for the preceding consecutive 12 months prior to the start of the academic year for which assistance is requested.



Illinois Residency Rule Amendment, Effective Beginning in 2024-25

From General Provisions, Section 2700.20 Definitions

"Resident of Illinois" -

A dependent student is a resident of Illinois if the parent of the dependent applicant, who is required by the instructions to complete the FAFSA or the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid, physically resides within the State of Illinois, and Illinois is the parent's true, fixed and permanent home.

An independent student is a resident of Illinois if the applicant physically resides within the State of Illinois (at the time of application), and has so resided for a period of 12 continuous, full months immediately prior to the start of the academic year for which assistance is requested and Illinois is their true, fixed and permanent home.

When an applicant does not qualify as a resident of Illinois under the preceding 2 paragraphs and the applicant is a member of the U.S. Armed Forces or a foreign missionary, or is the dependent or the spouse of an individual who is a member of the U.S. Armed Forces or a foreign missionary, or is a dependent student required to list an out-of-state parent contributor on the FAFSA form, then the applicant's residency shall be determined in accordance with the following:

An applicant who is a dependent student and physically resides in the State of Illinois with a parent but is required to list an out-of-state parent contributor on the FAFSA form may be considered a Resident of Illinois for the purpose of State financial aid programs. See Section 2700.50(e)(3).




- 3) If the institution has information that a dependent student physically resides with a parent within the State of Illinois, but the parent contributor listed on the FAFSA physically resides in another state, the institution shall review the applicant's residency eligibility for ISAC gift assistance programs to determine whether it should be based on the Illinois resident parent.
 - A) The institution will make this determination on a case-by-case basis upon confirming that the dependent student and Illinois parent reside in the State as evidenced by documentation as outlined in subsection (e)(4).
 - B) The institution shall notify ISAC of the determination.
 - C) A student's maximum annual MAP award amount shall be based on the need analysis calculation using the data of the parent who is required to provide financial information on the FAFSA or Alternative Application, according to the instructions provided on the respective applications.



Dependent Residency Override

- A check-box is available in the MAP system to allow schools to override the residency issue for students who have a disqualify code due to an out-of-state parent contributor
 - When a school submits one of these requests in the MAP system, they will also have to check the ""Include Ineligible" and "Disqualify" checkboxes on the Submit Payment Requests screen
- For FTP payment processing, a Dependent Residency Override field was added to the file layout to provide a Y indicator, if needed


2025-26 MAP Start-Up

- The 2025-26 MAP Start-Up Formula was approved at the September 19, 2024, Commission Meeting
 - o FY26 Start-up formula remains the same as FY25 Recompute formula:
 - 2021-22 reported tuition and fees
 - the 2021-22 Pell Grant Payment Schedule
 - a \$5,200 living allowance
 - an \$8,400 maximum award

- The 2025-26 FAFSA became available at the end of November, and the 2025-26 Alternative Application was launched on December 6
- MAP eligibility information was made available to schools in the MAP system on December 30

2025-26 MAP Start-Up

- 2025-26 MAP 160 Byte File Layout Specifications may be accessed via the Electronic Tools area of the e-Library for Partners.
 - There have been no changes made to the file layout for 2025-26
- At this time, the Alternative Application Student Record School File Layout has not yet been provided for the 2025-26 processing cycle.





2025-26 Alternative Application

- The questions on the 2025-26 Alternative Application are consistent with the 2025-26 FAFSA and it collects all data elements needed to calculate an SAI
- Similar to an ISIR, the Alternative Application Student Record includes all application data elements
 - The order of the data in the file layout follows the order of the ISIR and the values are the same, unless otherwise noted
 - Available as a text file in Notepad
 - Using free Notepad++ app provides more user-friendly viewing
 - The Alternative Application Student Record School File Layout document provides details about field names, length of data fields, and start and end positions
- Creating/uploading Alternative Application Student Record files to colleges' internal systems is not required
 - Relevant student applicant data provided in GAP Access may be relied on to administer MAP for both FAFSA and Alternative Application applicants







Making Adjustments to Alternative Application Student Records

- A process is available in the MAP system that provides colleges with the ability to submit professional judgment adjustments and make corrections for Alternative Application student records
- Professional Judgment and Application Correction tabs are available on the Student Detail: Eligibility screen in the MAP system for Alt App records only
- Colleges may rely on the same policies and procedures they have in place for FAFSA applicants who have special or unusual circumstances
- During the update process, messaging will appear if data is removed from a required data field, and the user will not be able to proceed to the next page until required information has been entered
- Once all changes/updates have been entered, you must select a "Submit" button to complete the process

Each year the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) is responsible for adopting an allocation formula for the Monetary Award Program (MAP). The Commission approves a "start-up" formula that is used to begin making award announcements for students applying for the next academic year. Typically, once the Governor and General Assembly take final action on the budget, the Commission revisits the formula in June or July and takes action to approve a "recompute"

School Requirements

ISAC No Longer Reporting Default Status

Students who apply for financial aid [via the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) or the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid (Alternative Application)] and agree to share the information with ISAC are considered for a Monetary Award Program (MAP) grant. The announcement process begins with the college sending an award notification to eligible students indicating a calculated annual award amount. The inclusion of MAP grants in financial aid packages is critical information for students to make informed enrollment decisions. Potentially eligible students are Illinois residents with an SAI under 9000 who indicated a MAP-approved school as one of their school choices on the FAFSA or Alternative Application.

In order to ensure that all MAP recipients receive the same information about their award in a consistent manner, ISAC requires schools to announce MAP awards to the students enrolled at their Institution - Including the estimated amount of the award. Refer to the School Requirements section for details.
