Postsecondary and Career Expectations

Each student should have an individualized learning plan to help make decisions about career and post-secondary (PS) education or training, to plan a course of study, and to make financial aid assessments with family members.



By the end of 8th grade

A student should be supported to:

- Use an interest inventory to explore how interest relates to careers
- Attend a career exploration day
- Begin determining eligibility for AP and Dual Credit courses
- Participate in Reality Store

A student should know:

- The concept of career clusters
- How salary impacts standard of living



By the end of 9th grade

A student should be supported to:

- Revisit their career interest inventory and see how interest has involved
- Meet with their counselor to develop a 4 year plan for high school
- Re-evaluate eligibility for AP and **Dual Credit courses**
- Take PSAT 9 exam

A student should know:

- How to participate in job shadowing
- The connection between HS courses, PS education, and careers (C³)
- How attendance and course work will impact postsecondary plans
- Benefits of early college credit opportunities
- Education requirements, cost, and expected entry level salary for desired career

By the end of 10th grade

- Interpretation of PSAT 9 exam scores
- Take PSAT 10 exam
- Attend basics of college and financial aid presentation

A student should know:

- How to participate in job shadowing

- Understand their skills align to career interest and how to develop any additional skills needed
- Know different types of postsecondary degrees and certificates

By the end of 11th grade

- If applicable, students should receive industry based certifications
- Re-evaluate eligibility for AP and Dual Credit courses
- Interpretation of PSAT 10 exam scores
- Students take PSAT/NMSQT exam
- Students take SAT exam
- Attend a college fair
- · Determine readiness for college-level coursework in math/ELA and enrollment in either "catch up" or "speed up" course
- Attend a Financial Aid Process presentation

A student should know:

- How to participate in job shadowing
- The connection between HS courses. PS education, and careers (C³)
- Visit at least 2 postsecondary institutions
- Safety, match, and reach schools
- Negative impact of remediation on PS goals
- Entrance requirements including application deadlines for expected PS programs of study
- Where to find scholarship opportunities

By the end of 12th grade

A student should be supported to:

- If applicable, students should receive industry based certifications
- Meet with their counselor to ensure all steps of PS process are completed on time
- Attend a Financial Aid workshop and complete FAFSA

A student should know:

- How to transfer articulated credit to the CC
- The connection between HS courses, PS education, and careers (C³)
- Entrance requirements including application deadlines for expected PS programs of study

By 12/31, a student should have:

- Complete 3 or more admission applications to PS intuitions by application deadline
- Attend a Financial Aid workshop and complete FAFSA
